



Won Buddhism Chicago Scholarship

Application Instructions

1. Applicants for Won Buddhism of Chicago (WBC) Scholarships must attend schools located in Illinois. Students will be evaluated on the basis of criteria including academic achievements (through grades, honors, and awards), essay, extracurricular school activities, financial need, leadership, and community involvements for betterment of society.
2. To be eligible for consideration for a scholarship, the student must be expected to graduate with an overall high school unweighted GPA of 3.0 or higher in 2021.
3. Each Scholarship Application must include a complete application form and a copy of official high school transcripts (from 9th Grade through present), including SAT or ACT scores.
4. Scholarship winners will be announced no later than April 17, 2021. At that time, each scholarship awardee must email one digital photo to Won Buddhism of Chicago to be used in a press release to local newspapers, along with a short video clip that is played at the virtual award ceremony on Sunday, April 25, 2021 between 10:00AM and 1:00PM.
5. The application deadline is Saturday, April 6, 2021. The application MUST be post-marked on or before April 6, 2021, or delivered in person or electronically submitted by 5PM, April 6, 2021.

7. All applicants must sign and date the Certification of Accuracy and Release of Information Waiver.
